- O Implemented online survey designs for measuring Americans' perceptions of intersectional economic inequality against objective Census Bureau data, analyzed participant responses using R, reported findings from this work via poster and data blitz presentations, as well as expansions of this work as a completed master's thesis study and other theoretical extensions of the proposed models.
- Ocollaborated with an undergraduate advisee to design and implement an online survey measuring spontaneous stereotype content regarding non-binary targets with differing romantic partner gender identities, analyze initial data and complete the student's summer research fellowship, and developed an expansion of this work as an undergraduate honors thesis.
